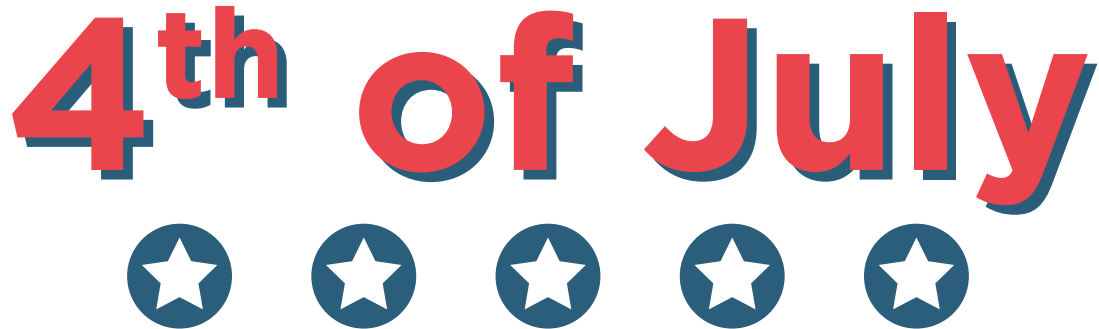


Independence Day Flash Cards
